Operating States

Central Coast College is approved to operate only within California. The institution has not determined whether its programs meet the educational requirements for licensure, certification, or credentialing in any state other than California.

State Disclosure for Programs leading to Licensure or Certification

Central Coast College (CCC) has determined that the following programs meet the educational requirements for specific state licensing required for employment. CCC has only evaluated educational requirements for the State of California, where the institution is approved to operate and where all enrolled students must reside.

Nurse Assistant	Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA)	California Department of Health	Graduates of the Nurse Assistant program are eligible to apply to take California's Nurse Assistant competency exam, administered through a CDPH-approved testing vendor. Passing both parts of the exam (a written or oral knowledge test and a skills evaluation) qualifies graduates for certification and placement on the California Nurse Aide Registry, which is required for employment as a Nurse Assistant in the state of California.
Phlebotomy Technician	LFS-approved exam	California Department of Health Services, Laboratory Field	Graduates of the Phlebotomy Technician program are eligible to apply for an LFS-approved examination. Passing an LFS-approved examination then qualifies graduates to apply to the California Department of

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		Services (DHS-LFS)	Health Services Laboratory Field Services (DHS-LFS) for California State Certification, which is required for employment as a Phlebotomy Technician in a laboratory setting in the state of California.
Veterinary Technology	Veterinary Technician National Examination (VTNE) and Registered Veterinary Technician (RVT)	American Association of Veterinary State Board and California Veterinary Medical Board and	Graduates of the Veterinary Technology program are eligible to apply for the Veterinary Technician National Examination (VTNE), administered by the American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB). Passing the VTNE, along with the California Veterinary Technician Examination and other licensure requirements set by the California Veterinary Medical Board, qualifies graduates to become a Registered Veterinary Technician (RVT), which is required for employment as a veterinary technician in the state of California.
Vocational Nurse	NCLEX-PN (LVN)	Bureau of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (BVNPT)	Graduates of the Vocational Nurse program are eligible to apply for the NCLEX-PN licensing examination with the Bureau of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (BVNPT). Nursing boards in each state establish the requirements for licensure for their state and requirements vary state by state. Students who intend to use their Central Coast College Vocational Nursing Diploma to secure licensure outside of the state of California will need to review the nursing licensing board in that state and contact them to verify eligibility.

Physical Location Determination

Central Coast College determines the student's physical location during the admissions process. Applicants share their address on the Application for Admission. Their address is verified through a government issued ID that is collected as part of the admissions process. Students located outside of California are not accepted into Central Coast College.

Students at Central Coast College can update their personal information, including address, by completing a Student Information Form (please see your campus Registrar). Please note, students must notify the institution if they plan to relocate out of state.

If an enrolled student moves out of California, Central Coast College provides direct notice to the student via email within 14 days after the day the change in determination is identified by Legacy Education. Relocating out of state may adversely impact a student's ability to complete their program. Students are encouraged to speak with ICH staff before relocating to determine options for continuing training or withdrawing prior to moving outside of California.
